

Bibliographic Committee Meeting Minutes
March 28, 2008

In attendance: June Hund, Terry O'Malley, Mike Yeager, Dana Bjorklund, Denise Green, Rosanna Masley, Deb Dennison, Chris Thornton, Rich Wesninski

1. Minutes from 12/14/07 meeting approved.
2. Introductions among committee members: Dana Bjorklund (CIA joined our committee in December 2007), Rich Wesninski (KSL's metadata cataloger) and Denise Green (CIM's music librarian) are our newest members.
3. Discussion about E-books:
 - a. Number of e-books in catalog: 212,290 as of 3/20/08. Rich continues to add; publishers include ABC Clio, Safari, Oxford, Springer, Chadwick.
 - b. June: question about occasional problem – titles in OhioLINK E-book Center sometimes do not appear in Case catalog.
 - i. Chris reminds that books in OhioLINK E-book Center do not necessarily have MARC records available, which may account for some of the delay.
 - c. Past loading procedure: OLINK would load certain books in the E-book Center; Ann Gilliland would send notice that file is ready to be loaded.
 - d. June: should each Case library add E-books from OhioLINK according to that library's subject area?
 - i. Chris & general agreement is that it is better to have one person handle loading responsibility.
 - ii. Suggestion, to which Rich agreed, is to set up a wiki for E-book alerts to staff.
4. Mike discussed transferring item records: option no longer available in Anzio (only in Millennium).
 - a. Mike is not notified in advance on content of III's weekly patches to the system, thus no way to notify staff in advance.
 - b. Inexplicably, libraries in OhioLINK may get different patches at different times. Our limiting problem has been fixed but Mike noticed other schools reporting similar problem later: in other words, III apparently did not address this problem on a system-wide basis.
5. Mike encourages anyone with system problems to contact him.
6. Terry mentions that location and country codes are not in Millennium. Mike will port over.
7. Short discussion on Round table, composition of, mandate, etc.
8. Bib Committee website:
 - a. Chris on location update: committee information available at old site; with change in web, committee has new site to which old info will be transferred; work continues on updating mandate, etc.
9. June on catalogers tools: Catalogers desktop, Classification Web, LC publications: Smith and Law continue to receive Cataloging Service Bulletin, and Free Floating Subdivisions via Depository program; Harris will cancel

10. Upcoming NOTSL/OLAC conference in September
11. Susan Hill (ILL) & Lenore Maxa (cataloging)/Allen, recently retired.
12. Dana: bindery question: CIM and CIA will explore mutual pick-up/delivery options
13. TOC: short discussion on use of 505 and 970 fields; catalogers occasionally add 505s dependent on subject interest/importance to library. 907s display well, but are too labor intensive to manually input. OhioLINK had been adding 970s but proved problematic.

15. June: No shelf required: <http://noshelfrequired.blogspot.com/> Moderated discussion about e-book issues
